-mechanics




Ivy

I learned that when starting a business you can't take out too many loans because then you might not have enough money to pay them back!




Everett

My biggest frustration was having to pay off the loans when you are in the negatives and having to fix vandalism when you don't have enough money.




Audrey



I learned how to make money by lowering prices and building different rides to keep my customers happy.







My biggest frustration was trying to get more guests in the park. I learned that advertising helps get guests to parks and lifts your ratings!







My biggest frustration was that the mechanics sometimes wouldn't fix my rides because they didn't have jobs that were assigned to them.





I learned that you should raise prices if your customers want the product and you should lower the price if they don't!





I learned how to make money by making rides more fun for your customers!




Oliver



I was frustrated when I had to restart three times because I kept going into debt since I wasn't able to pay off my loans. I learned I should pay off my loans as I earn money.




Riley

off your loans.






Patrick

The most frustrating part of building my roller coaster was when it crashed because I forgot to add the chain lift. The cars had too much energy!





I learned that it takes time and patience to get people to come to your parks. I built different rides to get people interested so they would visit.





I learned that loans can be good but you need to make sure you pay them back. With the loans, I purchased different rides and food stands to make a profit. Then I used the profit to pay back the loan.





I learned that you need to put a chain lift on a roller coaster because the chain gives it kinetic energy, so it can go up the hill.




Claire

The most frustrating part of the project was the amount of people complaining about the vomit on the pathways. I had to hire a handyman to clean the area so customers were happy.





I learned that if you get too many workers and too much of a loan, you can lose your money fast. I had to hire a small amount of people first and then pay back loans with my profits.




Leena

The most frustrating part was when the roller coaster crashed and I had to fix it. After I fixed it, I made the price of the ride free to get customers interested in the ride again.




Jeremy

I learned that when building roller coasters there are some challenges, like not having enough money. I had to wait and be patient to make money first.




Kevin

My biggest frustration was people leaving the park because the of the vandalism or if rides weren't working. To fix this I hired more security and assigned them to specific spots in the park.





One of my biggest frustrations I had was when I couldn't pay off my loan because I took out too much money. I had to pay off my loan by rising prices!





The most frustrating part was having to pay off my loan. I learned that loans are borrowed money from the bank and you need to pay it back with the profit you make.





The most frustrating part was all the vandalism in my park. I had to fix broken benches, lights and trash cans and hire a security guard.





I learned that it is really hard to keep a business running because you can start to lose money when building rides, and rides can break down. So you need to hire mechanics to fix them.





The most frustrating part of the project was when the guests broke the benches and lights. I had to have mechanics fix them and hire security guards.





I learned that when starting a business you shouldn't take a lot of loans out because you need to pay them back. Also you need to make sure your customers are happy.





I learned how to build different rides!




Landon

I learned that when you get a loan, you actually have to pay it back. Also you need to make sure walkways go the correct way, and that mechanics and handymen do their assigned jobs.





I learned that when you take a lot of loans out you can go into debt. So you need to pay your loan back and not over spend.




Natalie

The most frustrating part of the park was the vandalism. I had to rebuild everything that was broken and hire a security guard.





I learned that it takes a lot of money to build a roller coaster because you have to pay back the loan you need to build it and pay your workers to fix it!





I learned that you need to make sure all rides connect to pathways so you have an exit for your guests.




Nayely

My biggest frustration was when guests complained about the litter so I had to hire handyman to clean it up!




Makenzie
